SHORTCUTS

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VOLUNTEERING FINGERPRINTING SAFE ENVIRONMENT TRAINING

Any parent who wishes to volunteer at the school (for example, lunchroom helper, coach, field trip chaperone, mystery reader, classroom volunteer, etc.) must be fingerprinted/background checked and cleared through the Diocese of Orlando.

The cost is approximately \$50.00. We strongly suggest making an appointment ASAP as it can take anywhere from 6-12 weeks for fingerprints and background checks to clear. You may not volunteer in any capacity until you have been cleared.

The Diocesan fingerprinting procedure has been computerized. You may begin the process by logging on to www.orlandodiocese.org. When you go to the main page, you will see a dark orange tab at the top labeled "How do I..." – click here and then click on the link to "register for safe environment training and fingerprinting". You will need to complete two different processes.

First, register for an appointment to be fingerprinted (there are many options of places this can be done) and then separately you need to take an interactive safe environment course on your personal time via your computer and complete the corresponding quiz. Upon passing the quiz, please print it out and return to the St. James school front office attn.: Linda Puntel. **When registering to be fingerprinted, you will need the following specific code designating you as a volunteer of St. James school: FPSJSchoolVol.

IMPORTANT TO NOTE: This policy applies to all employees, parents, chaperones, and volunteers of St. James Cathedral School.

UNIFORM ORDERING & RECYCLING

All links to purchase approved School Uniforms and Spirit Wear may be found in our Panther Store on our school website.

Risse Brothers Uniforms is the official supplier of regular (non-PE) uniforms for Preschool through 8th grade. School uniforms may not be purchased from another source. Orders may be shipped for an additional fee. Please refer to the school handbook for uniform specifications. **Website: www.rissebrothers.com.** Through our Uniform Recycle Center, the school offers recycled uniforms for FREE!

PE Uniforms (grades K-8) are sold and distributed by the school throughout the year on a rotational basis via the Panther Athletic Club (PAC). PE apparel may be purchased via the Panther Store found on the school website.

Spirit Gear - Once per week on Fridays, students may wear an official Spirit Wear shirt (club or team shirts are not permitted) with PE shorts or regular school bottoms. Regular school shoes must be worn and uniform accessory rules still apply on Spirit Day. "Spirit Gear" includes shirts and other items that show our "panther pride" for all members of the family. This gear may be purchased via the Panther Store or at Meet the Teacher.

How many uniforms should I purchase? This decision is clearly based on one's laundering habits and routines, as well as budget. A good rule of thumb is 3 Standard Uniforms, 1 full PE set (number of PE classes per week varies by age; middle school students have PE classes 2 times per week), and 1 Spirit Wear set which all children have the option to wear on Fridays.

SAFETY IS OUR #1 CONCERN

We do not take lightly the ministry and privilege of protecting your most prized, God-given possessions.

On your school tour, you saw all of our staff wearing name badges and all volunteers/visitors wearing bright yellow tags, learned about our safety cameras, campus police officer, our buzzer system, and more.

In addition to those measures, we have 3 automated external defibrillator (AED) machines on campus and all of our teachers are CPR certified and trained to use the defibrillators.

We have a campus officer on campus who is always present during drop-off and dismissal times.



MASS

Parents are always welcome at Mass each week on Wednesdays at 8:00am in the Assembly Hall. All school Masses and liturgical services can be found on the Parent Portal Calendar. Students in grades K-2 have a "Mass buddy", an older student in 6th-8th grade with whom they are paired. Children sit with their "Mass buddy" at all services, as well as participate in special religious learning activities throughout the year. The following are frequently asked questions regarding Mass:

Do I go with my child to their classroom in the morning before

Mass? No, you can go straight to the Assembly Hall. Please enter through the main doors facing the turf to receive your yellow visitor tag.

Do I sit with my child and his/her class? You can sit with your child in the bleacher area of the assembly hall or with their class.

In the handbook, it states children must wear the full regular uniform on Mass days. What if they have PE class on these

days? Children in grades K-2 may wear their PE uniforms to school on Mass days. Children in grades 3-8 must wear their regular uniform to school on Mass days and bring their PE uniform to change later for their enrichment class.

CARPOOL

Detailed information and maps regarding carpool can be found in the School Handbook. Please note that at "Meet the Teacher" (the day prior to the first day of school) each family will receive a laminated carpool tag stating your child's last name to be displayed on your dashboard for carpool dismissal. If you do/did not receive this, please contact the front office.

It is helpful to note that if you have multiple children or are carpooling, the oldest child always goes to the youngest child's carpool pick-up location. When you receive your password and link to create your Parent Portal account, you will be able to enter all persons you permit to pick-up your child(ren). A photo ID may be requested at any time for pickup and release of your child.

PRESCHOOL PROGRAM

Below please find our "Top 10" Helpful Hints for Pre-K3 and Pre-K4 families.

1 Arrival: Parents must park and walk their child into school for drop off. We encourage and welcome you to join us for prayer and pledge outside each day on the Pre-K playground at 8:05am. Please note: early care is free of charge and available from 7-8:00am.

Dismissal: Families have two options for dismissal. Guardians may walk-up and enter through the preschool gate on Cathcart Street to check-out their child starting at 3:15pm or they may use the carpool line starting at 3:30pm and ending at 3:45pm in the same location. Your child will be brought to your car; the vehicle operator is to remain in the driver seat. Car-seats/ boosters must be installed closest to the curb (behind the passenger seat). Please note that older siblings always come to their youngest sibling for carpool procedures.

(Appropriate parking areas/spots will be covered at Meet the Teacher and in the Preschool Handbook)

- 2 Preschool children do not need a backpack; a special school bag and folder will be provided at Meet the Teacher in August. The bag and folder will travel to and from school each day.
- 3 Each child needs a complete change of uniform (underwear and socks, too!) sent in a Ziploc bag labeled with his/her name the first day of school. The bag will remain in your child's cubby and used as needed.
- 4 Each child will need a rest mat, clearly labeled with your child's name. We recommend the "Mint Nap Mat", available online from various retailers or another nap mat with built in pillow and blanket that is machine washable. In addition to the mat, each child may bring in one small plush to sleep with during nap time. On Fridays, all sleep items will go home with your family so they can be washed and returned on Monday. Please note: nap mats must be able to fit in a preschool cubby.
- 5 Lunch is included in the Pre-K3 & Pre-K4 tuition. A monthly menu will be provided in advance. We encourage you to send a lunch from home in a labeled lunchbox if you believe your child may not like what is being served on a given day. On noon dismissal days, lunch is provided for Pre-K children unless otherwise indicated via an email from the director.
- 6 Snack is provided daily by the families on a rotating basis with a basket or bag that will be provided by the classroom teacher. There is a specific allergy friendly snack list that must be followed; any snacks sent in that do not adhere to the list cannot be served.
- 7 We will be using a special app to allow you to sign your child in and out to us each day as well as to communicate with you. More details will be provided at Meet the Teacher.
- 8 There are lots of opportunities to get involved such as mystery reader, class parties, field day, and more. Additional information will be provided at Meet the Teacher. Lunch helpers are always welcomed. All preschool classes eat in their classroom "family style" at 11:00am daily. Please note: all volunteers must have cleared fingerprints on file.
- **9** If your child is going to be absent, or more than one hour tardy to school, please email the teacher and the director.
- **10** All Pre-K3 and Pre-K4 students wear the same uniform each day that can be purchased at Risse Brothers. Children are to wear all white or all black sneakers with white socks.









LUNCH

Daily hot lunch is provided for a fee at our school for families who wish to participate. (Lunch is included in the Pre-K 3 & 4 tuition).

You can learn more about the program, cost, set-up a family debit account (your child does not/cannot pay daily with cash), and find the monthly menus via the Parent Portal.

BEFORE & AFTER SCHOOL CARE

BEFORE SCHOOL - Children may be dropped off at school in the cafeteria starting at 7:00am where they will be supervised free of charge until the first bell rings at 7:40am. A staff member or officer will be on the front school steps to greet children upon their arrival.

Once the bell rings, students will proceed to their homerooms. Kindergarten students and their siblings/carpool mates arriving from 7:30am on are to be dropped off at the Kindergarten drop/off pick-up gate on Hillman Street. Prior to 7:30 AM these students would proceed to the cafeteria like the rest of the student body.

AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM (ASP), an extension of learning and fun outside the regular classroom runs Monday-Friday from dismissal-6:00 PM and is available to all students in grades K-8 on a full -time or part-time basis. We are also open for select student holidays and breaks from 7:30 AM-6:00 PM with an array of fun activities that take place on and off campus.

Students are grouped and supervised in a safe and secure environment according to grade level with structured activities, including an opportunity to complete homework in a quiet setting. A snack will be provided.

PAID ENRICHMENT PROGRAMS

Paid Enrichment activities are run through our After School Program and are available to all students K-8th. Those who participate must *register* in ASP to ensure the safety of our children. ASP registrants are classified as either "Registered" or "Enrolled".

A "registered" only student is considered a "drop-in" where there is no monthly billing. An "enrolled" student has selected either a part-time or full-time ASP plan with recurring monthly billing.

ASP Paid Enrichment activities are offered for an additional fee and may include cheerleading, choir, robotics, chess, cooking, golf, and more.

ATHLETICS

Our athletic offerings for Pre-K4 through 8th grade students are administered by a Diocesan-wide league called Catholic Youth Sports (CYS). Information on specific sports seasons, game schedules, and registration details can be found by accessing the Student Life tab on our website. We have two athletic directors, one for the Pre-K4 -5th grade students and the other for middle school (grades 6th-8th) children.

GRADE SCHOOL (PRE-K4 – 5TH)

Athletes in this division will focus on skills development and friendly competition. Children participate in one game per week which takes place during the weekend. Practices may be held only once per week after school hours. Sports offerings include: Fall Coed Soccer, Flag Football, Girls Lacrosse, Track, Spring Coed Soccer, Coed Basketball.

MIDDLE SCHOOL (6th-8th)

Middle school athletes participate in competitive play against other Catholic Schools in the greater Orlando area (12 schools are divided into northern and southern regions). Students are encouraged to join PAC regardless of playing experience, but team commitment is expected. Games take place during the week and weekends. Practices are held on weekday afternoons. The SJCS family often refers to middle school sports as the Panther Athletic Club or PAC. Go Panthers! Sports offerings include Soccer, Track, Basketball, Volleyball, and Flag Football.



Many of our students play multiple sports to help broaden their social and athletic experiences.

STAYING CONNECTED BETWEEN NOW & START OF SCHOOL YEAR...

Please take time to preview the Summer Checklist and complete these items in advance.

Additionally, for families with children entering grades pre-K3, pre-K4, and Kindergarten, you will receive an invitation to a class play date to be held during the summer on campus. This is a great way to meet friends before the year starts and feel more comfortable on school grounds.

For families with a child(ren) entering grades 1-8, you will be contacted by a Panther Partner Family – a "veteran" St. James family who has a child in the same grade as yours -- and they will invite you to meet-up (maybe for icecream, pizza, at the park, etc.). This is completely optional.

At the meet-up, the "veteran" St. James parents can walk you through any questions you may have and your child will make a new friend and have a familiar face to look for on the first day of school!

Please note: class lists will be released at Meet the Teacher for pre-K3 and pre-K4 students, as well as grades first through eighth.

Kindergarten students will receive a post-card in the mail in early August from their respective homeroom teacher.

OVER THE SUMMER CHECKLIST

Most documents referenced throughout this guide and below will be found on your Parent Portal, under the Student Information tab, then organized under Resource Documents. Additional information can be found on our school website at stjcs.com.

- Check for an email from the school on June 1st containing your access link to set-up your RenWeb Parent Portal Account.
- **By June 15**, set up your FACTS account and make tuition payment selection. The use of this program is mandated by the Diocese. Directions are on the Parent Portal.
- Check the Parent Portal for Summer Reading Lists (grades 1-8).
- Check the Parent Portal for School Supply Lists (Pre-K through 8th) and purchase on your own or buy a supply pack via our Panther Store on the school website. You will receive an email in early June to remind you should you wish to participate in the pre-packaged supply program offered by the school.
- Purchase School Uniforms (links available through the Panther Store).
- Purchase PE Uniforms via our Panther Store.
- Register for the After School Program (ASP) via the Student Life Tab on our school website – this is for ALL students (fulltime, part-time, drop-in, emergency situations, and/or Paid Enrichment participants).
- In late July, check out the updated Paid Enrichment offerings under the Student Life Tab on our school website.
- Join PPA and complete an interest inventory to make life-long friends and begin your Panther Promise journey (information found under the Get Involved tab on our website).
- Check out the Scrip program to learn about saving money on your tuition on the Parent Portal.
- Attend one or both of the summer play dates and casual orientations (for Pre-K3/Pre-K4 and Kindergarten families) or be on the lookout for an email from a Panther Partner (for grades 1st-8th).

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ'S)

For birthdays, what is an acceptable treat to send in for my child's class? Birthdays are so special! A treat may be sent in so long as there is one for each member of your child's homeroom class. We ask that you send individual items that do not require cutting, such as cupcakes or doughnuts. Simply drop the item off at the front office with your child's name, homeroom, and grade clearly labeled. Your child will distribute their treat to classmates during lunch. *See the handbook for specifics on birthdays, invites, and allergies. Some grade levels have different policies. Your teacher will be in contact with you.

What if my child takes a daily medication or I want to have as-needed medication during a particular time period?

Medication must be in a labeled, un-opened bottle and accompanied by the Diocese of Orlando Parent/Guardian Medical Information and Consent form (found on the Parent Portal under Resource Documents). If a medicine is "as needed," this must be indicated. Parents hand deliver the medicine to the front office in a Ziplock bag labeled with the child's full name, grade, and homeroom teacher along with the appropriate forms.

We were informed that there is a student with dietary allergies in my child's class (dairy, peanut, etc.). Can I still send those items for my child's lunch? For example, may I send a peanut butter and jelly sandwich? Thank you for your concern for all our students. While we ask that certain grades adhere to a peanut and dairy free approved snack list (provided by your child's teacher), at lunch time students with allergies sit at a "safe table." Thus, if a classmate has a peanut allergy, for example, it is still okay for your child to bring a peanut butter and jelly sandwich, as the friend with an allergy will sit at the "safe table". Please note, our school lunch provider meets food and allergy guidelines.

In an emergency situation, how will the school communicate directives to the parents? The school will contact parents and guardians in two ways: a mass email and a mass text. It is imperative that you have entered working email addresses, as well as cell phone numbers, and indicated the proper carrier under your Parent Portal account . Please keep contact information up-to-date at all times via the parent portal.

What is the rain dismissal policy? If it is raining only, we will have a normal dismissal so please pack your child an umbrella or raincoat to be kept in their backpack. If there is lightening (or has been a strike within a ten-mile radius in a given 30-minute period), we will delay carpool dismissal but parents may choose to walk-in and sign their child(ren) out from designated check-out spots. Please refer to the handbook for specifics. Reminder-older siblings always go to their youngest sibling's spot.

What if I prefer to park and walk up to get my child at dismissal? You may meet your child where he/she or she would be picked up for carpool line (please stand outside of the fence) and ask a teacher to bring your child to you. Please refer to the School Handbook for carpool diagrams and appropriate parking.

REMINDER - As stated and explained in the school handbook, we ask that no students be signed out of school between 2:30pm and dismissal at 3:15pm for safety reasons. If you have a 4 o'clock appointment, for example, and wanted to get your child at 3pm, you must do so by 2:30pm.

What if... my child is sick, I have to take my child out of school early or I have a change of carpool plans, who should I notify and how? Please send an email to front.office@stjcs.com and send a courtesy copy to your child's classroom/homeroom teacher with pertinent information. All teachers' email addresses can be found on your Parent Portal and on our website.

What if I am late to carpool line, where do my children go? At 3:30pm, any child who has not yet been picked up is taken to the cafeteria and is signed into our After School Program. He/she will be well taken care of by our staff. No registration charge is assessed until after the second occurrence. Drop-in fees will be assessed unless you are enrolled in ASP at which time your plan allowance will be used.

Can you bring siblings with you when you volunteer? We love our future Panthers, but for safety reasons, siblings are not allowed to accompany parents who are volunteering. Many families find it easy and rewarding to swap care so that each of them can enjoy spending time serving and volunteering at the school.
