




### 2. The People of Sparks by Jeanne DuPrau


#### 4. *The Wild Robot* by Peter Brown

the wrong reasons—




4. *A Long Walk to Water* by Linda Sue Park

Fiction *A Long Walk to Water* begins as two stories, told in alternating sections, about two eleven-year-olds in Sudan, a girl in 2008 and a boy in 1985. The girl, Nya, is fetching water from a pond that is two hours walk from her home: she makes two trips to the pond every day. The boy, Salva, becomes one of the "lost boys" of Sudan, refugees who cover the African continent on foot as they search for their families and for a safe place to stay. Enduring every hardship from loneliness to attack by

armed rebels to contact with killer lions and crocodiles. Salva is a survivor, and his story goes on to intersect with Nya's in an astonishing and moving way.

5. *Ground Zero* by Alan Gratz 690L Realistic Historical Fiction September 11, 2001, New York City: Brandon is visiting his dad at work, on the 107th floor of the World Trade Center. Out of nowhere, an airplane slams into the tower, creating a fiery nightmare of terror and confusion. And Brandon is in the middle of it all. Can he survive -- and escape?

September 11, 2019, Afghanistan: Reshmina has grown up in the shadow of war, but she dreams of peace and progress. When a battle erupts in her village, Reshmina stumbles upon a wounded American soldier named Taz. Should she help Taz -- and put herself and her

family in mortal danger?



6. **Project 1065** by Alan Gratz 780L Realistic Historical Fiction Infiltrate. Befriend. Sabotage. World War II is raging. Michael O'Shaunessey, originally from Ireland, now lives in Nazi Germany with his parents. Like the other boys in his school, Michael is a member of the Hitler Youth. But Michael has a secret. He and his parents are spies. Michael despises everything the Nazis stand for. But he joins in the Hitler Youth's horrific games and book burnings, playing the part so he can gain insider knowledge. When Michael learns about Projekt 1065, a secret Nazi war mission, things get even more complicated. He

must prove his loyalty to the Hitler Youth at all costs -- even if it means risking everything he cares about.



1. **Refugee** by Alan Gratz


